Traveling to music workshops is a key part of our ministry learning process: Nalana and I traveled to a chant workshop last fall in Albuquerque, New Mexico, for an intensive study of Third Mode and Byzantine notation. We were very encouraged by our experience and by now you have heard many of the hymns in Third Mode we practiced and learned while at the workshop. I will attend the workshop again this fall at the beginning of November.

The chant ministry meets weekly before Vespers on Saturday for practice and chant instruction. We have singers of all different musical abilities, so our practice sessions are focused on learning the music for the regular Resurrection services as well as standard hymns, and basic byzantine notation.

I am very happy that our ministry is continuing to grow. I want to thank all the members, Fr. Christopher, Dn. Anthony, Jeff Aldridge, Louis Busta, Kh. Claire Dillon, Nalana La Framboise, Bill Young, Maria Lindsay, Dane Paquette, Willie Steiger, and Michael Swagerty.
